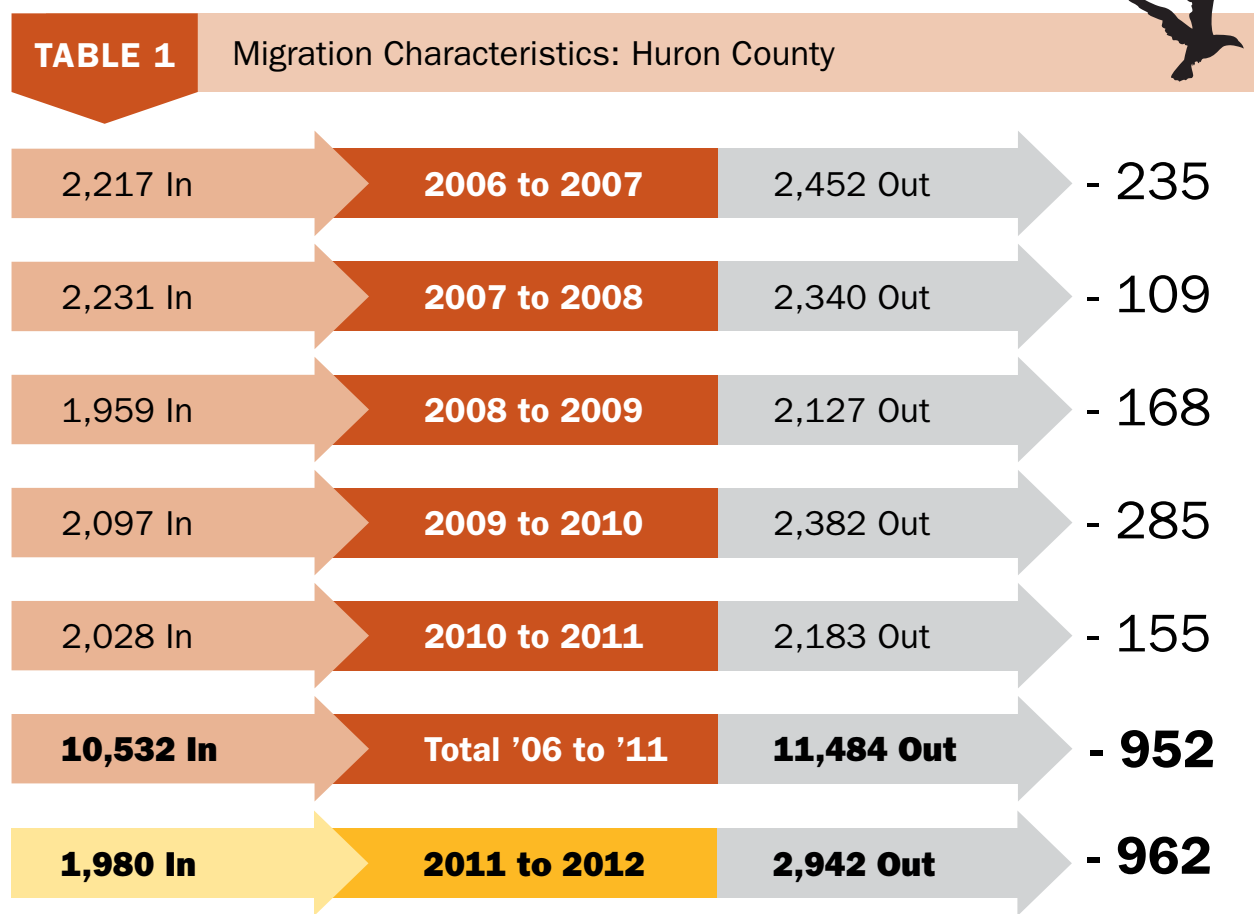

Huron County Migration Update

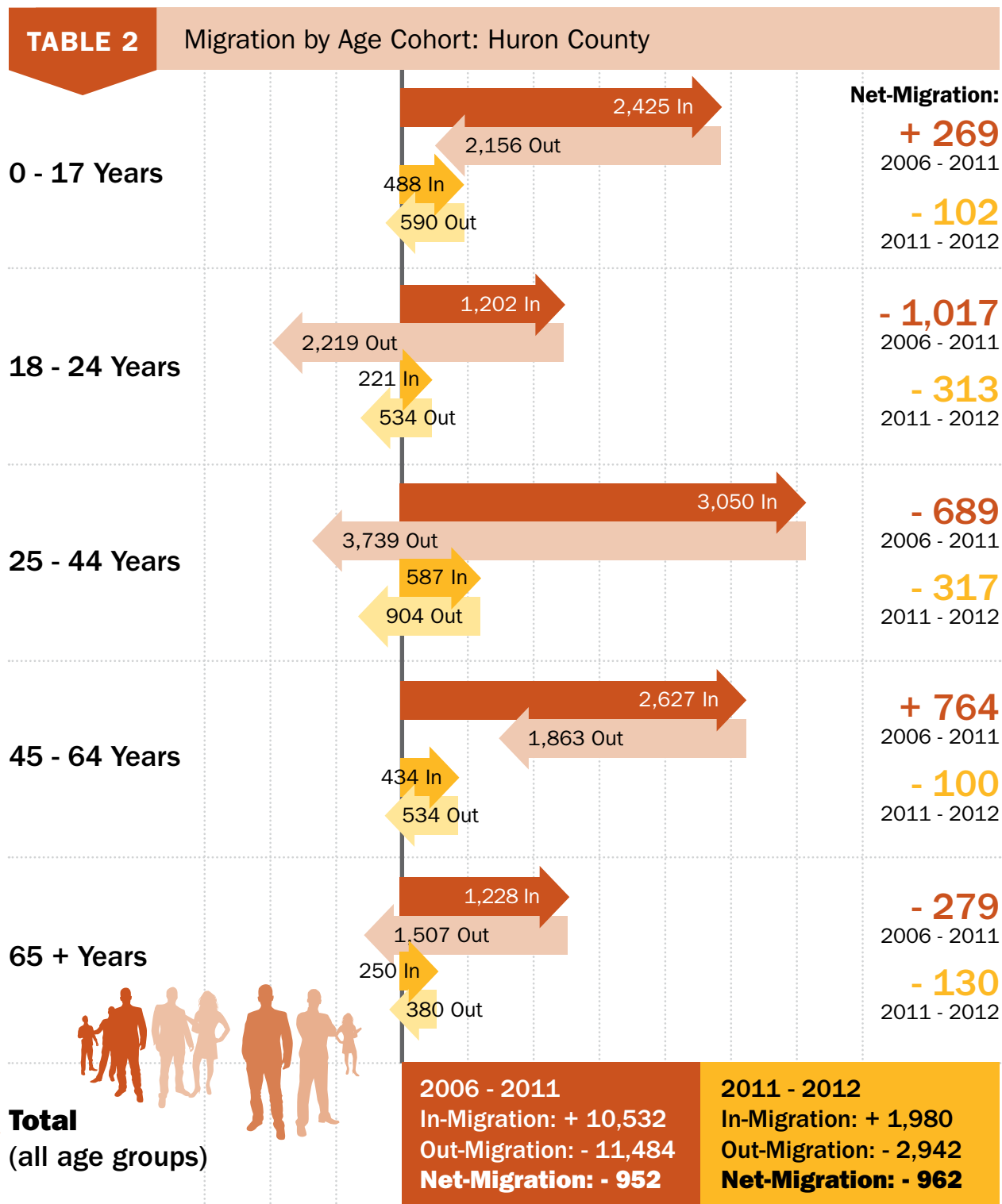
Overall, Huron County's 2011 to 2012 net migration loss exceeded its cumulative 2006 to 2011 net migration loss. In the five year period between 2006 and 2011, an aggregate net loss of 952 migrants occurred; in the one year period between 2011 and 2012, a net loss of 962 people occurred.

When looking specifically at the number of people who moved to Huron, 2011 to 2012 in-migration fell within the range of movement in previous years. However, out-migration from 2011 to 2012 showed a significant increase.

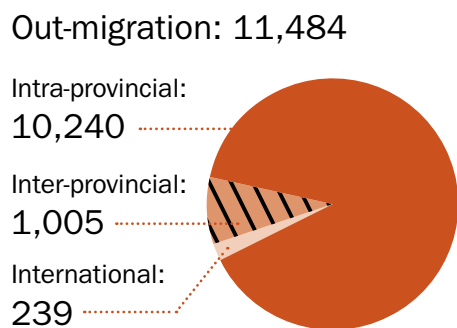
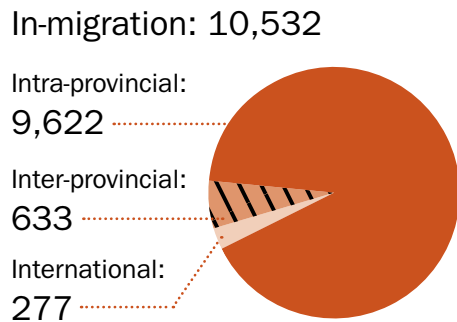
When Huron's migration patterns are examined by age, the 2011 to 2012 period resembles the 2006 to 2011 trends, where the majority of migrants were 25 to 44 years of age. A notable difference between the two time periods though, is that 2011 to 2012 showed a net-migration loss in all age categories.

The 2011 to 2012 period also showed that Huron County lost more people to Ontario communities (intra-provincial migration) than it gained from Ontario communities. Huron also continues to experience a net loss of people through inter-provincial migration and international migration.

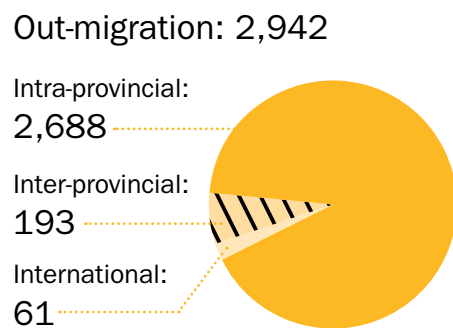
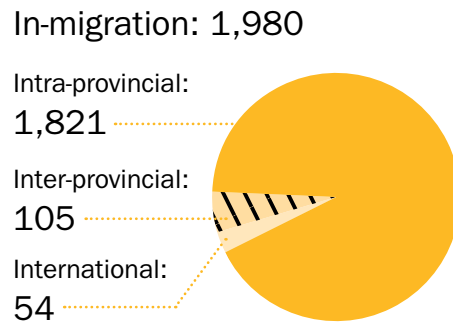
